Powerful nose, black fruit with elegant waxy notes, cocoa, plum preserve, fine mineral notes. [...] Powerful palate, fine tannins, a slight sweet fruit expression, good acidity, texture and length, varietal fruit of optimal ripeness and a balsamic finish.

### MosYca 2010

Intense nose black fruit of optimal maturity, liquorice, toasted oak, sweet wood and spices, flint, fine mineral and balsamic notes, a touch of peat and crayons. Powerful, ripe palate, cocoa, fruit liqueur, huge structure and ageing potential; mineral and balsamic finish.

### AlfYnal 2009

Dark cherry-red colour. Powerful aromas, varietal, ripe fruit, smooth and toasted oaky notes. Powerful, tasty mouth, with good concentration and acidity.

Intense nose, cocoa, plum preserve, blackcurrants, smoky oak, balsamic drops [...], some mineral notes. Powerful palate, it mirrors the note in the nose, fine tannins, sweet fruit, good acidity, texture and length.

Somehow closed at the beginning, the nose is opening on woody notes showing the rusticity of the Monastrell, and becomes more and more complex as it opens up in the glass. The mouth is fresh, fine and mineral with a very good balance, very expressive. Very good wine - *Luis Gutierrez*

### MosYca 2009

Cherry colour with garnet-red tint. Ripe fruit aromas, spices, smooth oak. Varietal and toasted notes. Powerful mouth with well-matured tannins.

Intense nose of great delicacy, blackcurrants, mineral (flint), balsamic herbs, cocoa, tobacco leaf. Flavourful palate, great structure and balance, mineral, fine fruit expression and great potential.
